Parents & Spectators

-  Parents/Spectators have a great influence over children and their enjoyment/success in football. All children play football because they want to be involved with the game and most of all it should be fun.
-  It is important to remember that however good a child becomes at football – we must all re-enforce the following points:
 - Children should enjoy football,
 - Children should have a sense of personal achievement,
 - Children should have self-esteem,
 - Children should be striving to improve their own skills and techniques.
-  As a parent/spectator your attitudes and expectations will have a significant bearing on children's attitudes towards:
 - Other players,
 - Managers, Coaches & Club Officials,
 - Match Officials,
 - Other Spectators.
-  All parents associated with Studley Juniors should always be positive and encourage all players and follow the guidelines below:
 - Applaud all players for both teams,
 - Never shout or scream at players during matches,
 - Never try to coach the children during training/matches,
 - Respect the match officials decisions at all times,
 - Encourage all players in the team - even those with less talent than others.

Please respect their wishes should they not want photographs to be taken and refrain from doing so.
